PARENT-TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Parent – Teacher interviews have given an excellent opportunity to discuss student progress, celebrate successes and identify areas for improvement. It is very important to talk with your child/ren about any points raised at the interview that need to be followed up. Involving children in developing their own goals, a sense of responsibility and ownership of achievements; and areas for improvement are what we want to see.

END OF TERM 1

Term 1 ends Friday 12th April and students with parent consent will be dismissed one hour earlier at 2:15pm. Term 2 commences on Monday 29th April. A reminder that we ask our school community to report any suspicious behaviour of people on site near buildings to police, particularly after dark. We are happy for the community to use the oval, playgrounds and courts; provided this is done safely and respectfully of our grounds and equipment. Those aged under 18 need to have an adult with them. Enjoy the school holidays with your children.

MID-YEAR (Term 3) INTAKE - PRESCHOOL:

We are currently taking expressions of interest for preschool enrolments for Term 3.

Children who turn 4 years of age before 1 November are eligible to start preschool mid-year the same year (term 3). Children who turn 4 years of age on or after 1 November are eligible to start preschool in intake 1, at the start of the following year.

Thank you to all those families who have already expressed their interest in accessing our preschool. Once expressions of interest are received and eligibility assessed, offers of placement will be made to eligible families. Please be advised that families of pre-school aged children from Wasleys and Roseworthy are zoned to Elsie Ey Children's Centre, based at Hewett Primary School.

It is important that parents meet their legislative and regulatory obligations when enrolling children in pre-school, with immunisation history provided from MyGov or the Australian Immunisation Register. Children cannot attend preschool before this information is provided.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION WORKSHOP

Creating Community Locally

WITH MARK LE MESSURIER









EDUCATOR WORKSHOPS FOR TEACHERS, COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERS, SUPPORT WORKERS AND PARENTS/CARERS

A DEEP DIVE to develop children and teen's social and emotional capacities.

WEDNESDAY 1ST MAY 2024 6 PM-9 PM

Take a DEEP DIVE into our children's social, emotional and behavioural needs. This 2-hour workshop reveals the hidden emotional baggage our most vulnerable students bring to school each day. It is a reminder that when lives are difficult, you will experience the shockwaves because co-educators work so closely with students and families. This is the reason why your work is increasingly complex, is never done, and will always be in progress.

I would also like to highlight the complexities neurodiversity brings into schools and classrooms, with a strong emphasis on Autism. Why? Because we are at a crossroads in the community and in schools. While most educators are good people, want to be inclusive, and want to offer children hope and futures, this vulnerable group and their educators, often struggle to bring this to fruition. How we think, talk and work with neurodiversity is a rapidly evolving, and sometimes an emotionally charged space. We are beginning to grasp that such differences in the emotion and behaviour of individuals with ADHD, Autism, Learning Disabilities and trauma, and more, are the result of physical differences in brain structures. This means a neurodivergent brain is built and wired-up differently. So, it processes and interacts with the world differently. It will always do so, because its operating system is a beautiful variation to an amazing human rhythm. No one ever grows out of being neurodivergent, so let's help them grow into it feeling proud and worthy.

Finally, let's reaffirm the connection between – emotion, relationship and behaviour. What we are seeing is that most student will not tolerate a 'behaviour management' approach that relies on rules without relationship, warmth, and connection. Especially when they already feel 'not good enough'. I'd like to explore a technique that safeguards a young person's emerging spirit by separating the behaviour from who they are, and who they can be in the future. I promise to leave you with some key "take-aways" as I introduce my 'GOOD GUIDE to work effectively with young people who exhibit tricky emotions and turbulent behaviours' – a much healthier approach than, "behaviour management".


