Question- How long did the organisation take?

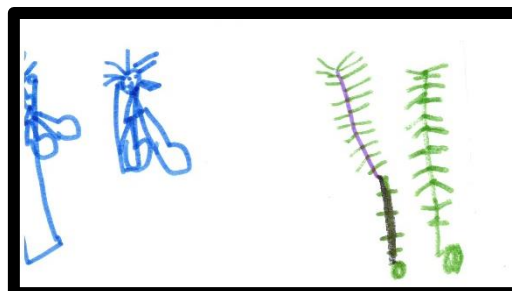
Response- It went over a couple weeks. It took up three break times.

Question- Would you recommend it to anyone else? Response- Yes and if you're in year 3 you should be able to do it next year.

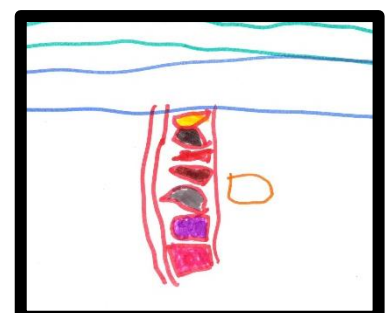
