2020 CLASS PLANNING

Planning for 2020 is well underway and at this stage we are planning to start the year with 13 classes. This may change depending on the number of new enrolments we receive between now and the start of the new school year.

To help us plan for 2020, we would appreciate you contacting the front office as soon as possible if you know:

- your child will NOT be starting at or returning to Freeling School P-7. (Excluding Year 7 students moving to Secondary School).
- you or any family/friends are intending to enrol children in our school or preschool for 2020.

When planning classes and considering student placements, we look at the chronological age, social and emotional needs of each student plus the overall cohort of students within the class. With all of these factors taken into consideration, it makes putting classes together a complex and lengthy process. Given the complexity of this process and the fact that our enrolments change on a daily basis, we will not confirm class placements until the week beginning the 13th January 2020. Letters will be sent to families via post. **Please ensure the front office has your current postal address.**

If you have information specific to your child's learning, social or emotional needs that you would like us to consider for 2020 (do not request specific teachers) this should be submitted in writing addressed to The Principal and dropped in at the Front Office by **COB Monday 11th November 2019**. An acknowledgement that we have received your letter will be sent to you in hardcopy via your child. It is extremely important that you provide us with any considerations with regard to class placements in writing however; acknowledgment that your letter has been received does not mean that we will be able to accommodate your request as there are many factors that need to be considered and some tough decisions to be made. Our aim is to provide the best teaching and learning environment for our 300+ students but we are also bound by funding, formulas and the number of students in each year level. We will endeavour to meet parent requests where possible, in the best interest of the teaching and learning environment for all students.

Please note that, once class placements are finalised and parents are notified of this in writing no changes will be made to classes.
