SENIOR CHOIR PREPARE FOR THE FESTIVAL OF MUSIC

On Tuesday, 16 of our choir students travelled down to Magic Millions at Morphettville for a 3 hour rehearsal of their song repertoire. It is amazing to hear the beautiful sound come together when around 400 voices from 16 different schools (that have been practicing independently at their own site), all come together for the first off-site rehearsal. There are 12 concerts across the Primary Schools Festival of Music series, featuring the collective choir presenting songs, a commissioned work (Adelaide's Sister Cities) and interspersed with assisting artists. Anyone is able to purchase tickets for the show and if you would like to see our Freeling students perform at Festival Theatre, we are a part of Concert #10 on Friday evening 20th September commencing at 7:30pm. Tickets are available through BASS.
