SPORTS DAY

On Thursday 26th September we are intending to hold our annual Sports Day. We are sending positive vibes that the weather will be ideal, however if the weather impacts adversely on our ability to run our Sports Day on the 26th, we will advise you via Facebook and Skoolbag as soon as the decision can be made.

We rely on the support of our families to volunteer and support us in making the day a success. Please, if you can:

- Put your name down at the front office if you can spare half an hour to assist the Parents & Friends to fill their Helper's Roster. Jobs include preparing food, organising pre-ordered lunches or serving at recess/lunch. Sharing the load gives everyone a chance to spend time watching their children during the day.
- Be 'Sun Smart'! We would like to see all staff, students and parents wearing sun protection clothing, hats and sun block. All students need to wear sneakers. Students are also encouraged to bring their own water bottle – labelled with their name and dressed in their house colours.
- Help setup the 4 house colour shade structures from 8:15am and take them down after the event and to assist with the placing of event equipment.

TOILETS - please remember to use the designated toilets – signage will be apparent. Adults with toddlers, please use the toilets for the disabled. (Centre toilet in the transportable toilet block).

ALL STUDENTS are to go to their classes as usual at the commencement of the school day. They must also return to their classroom at the end of recess and lunch so that they can be checked off against the roll.

During the morning events, children must remain with their class and teacher. After lunch, all students will be sitting in mixed class groups in their house teams. Each house team will have a designated teacher identifiable by their Hi-Vis vest. Any students that need to go to the toilet, **MUST BE SIGNED IN AND OUT BY THIS TEACHER**. If for any reason, you need to leave early with your child, you must also report to this teacher for signing out. Please understand, this process is important to ensure student safety....not to be difficult.

Book Week 2019

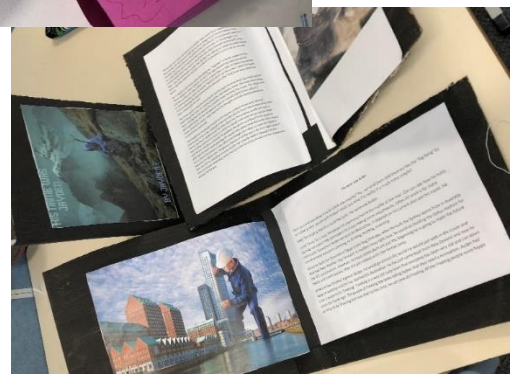
Students at Freeling celebrated another successful Book Week, with lots of reading, listening to stories and engaging in book activities. This year's theme was 'Reading is my secret power'.
